



New Zealand Driving Information

The following applicant has a '**Restricted Driving Licence**'.

The restricted licence means that the au pair has passed both the written and practical driving tests, and can drive legally in New Zealand, but will have to drive under the following conditions for 6 months if over 25 years of age, or 18 months if under 25. At which point she will obtain the full driving licence (no further test is required, just a payment).

The restrictions of this licence are:

- You must always have your restricted licence with you when you're driving.
- You can drive on your own, but not between 10pm and 5am. Between these times you must have a supervisor in the front passenger seat that holds and has held a full car licence for at least two years.
- If you sat the test in an automatic vehicle, your licence will say that you can only drive automatic vehicles.

Au Pairs from New Zealand who arrive with their restricted licence, will not hold the International Driving Permit, and will therefore not be allowed to drive in the US until they have passed the state driving licence.

I understand that I will need to pass the US state licence, at my own expense, when I arrive with my Host Family in America.

I also understand that Au Pair in America cannot guarantee continuation of any match if I am unable to gain the state driving licence, and I would forfeit my programme payments and be responsible for the cost of returning home.
